

The Ageing & Disability Commission (ADC) received 711 reports of alleged abuse, neglect and exploitation of an older person or adult with disability across South Western Sydney in 2020-2022\*.




Reports about adults with disability most commonly involved a parent\* as the subject of allegation



of reports about older people involved family members, mainly adult children followed by the adult's partner or spouse,\* as the subject of allegation



The most commonly reported type of abuse towards older people (OP) were verbal abuse, failure to meet support needs and theft of money\*`



The most commonly reported type of abuse towards adults with disability (AWD) were verbal abuse. failure to meet support needs and restricting access to supports/services\*`
