Psychological Abuse	Maria is an 80 year old woman and English is not her first language. She has a recent diagnosis of depression. Maria lives with her husband Vincent, and daughter, Theresa who moved in 4 months ago. Theresa notices that her father is very controlling, puts her mother down, and refuses to take Maria to church despite her repeatedly asking. Theresa is concerned of her mother's safety and things she is becoming quite withdrawn. There is a history of domestic and family violence.	<ul> <li>Behaviours – Vincent is verbally abusive, and is socially isolating Maria.</li> <li>Signs – Maria is becoming withdrawn.</li> </ul>
Neglect	<ul> <li>Sarah is a 35 year old woman. She has an intellectual disability and other chronic illnesses. She lives in social housing with her Mum, Jan, who is her carer and Power of Attorney.</li> <li>Jan has cancelled Sarah's disability services. Sarah's clothes are soiled and dirty and she appears to have lost weight.</li> </ul>	Behaviours – Jan has cancelled disability services. Signs – Sarah has lost weight and has soiled, dirty clothes.



George has bruising on his arms and says that Ken gets angry and has grabbed him but doesn't mean anything by it.Signs – Evidence of bruisi George's arm.	
Sexual AbuseTess is a 55 year old woman with a physical disability. She lives in a flat adjoining her daughter, Jackie and son-in-law John's property, and her rent is paid for by John.Behaviours – John is expen- himself, using sexually ex language and threatening Signs – Tess is anxious ar and avoids being alone w possible.Sexual AbuseUnbeknownst to Jackie, John has been making unwelcomed visits to Tess. John exposes himself and talks about what he would like to do with Tess in a sexually explicit way. John threatens that if Tess tells her daughter, he will stop covering her rent.Signs – Tess is anxious ar and avoids being alone w possible.Tess wants to tell her daughter and move away, but worries it will ruin their relationship and will affect her living arrangements.will stop	plicit Tess.
