
City of Hornsby



The Ageing & Disability Commission (ADC) received 29 reports related to allegations or concerns of abuse, neglect or exploitation of an older person or adult with disability in Hornsby in 2020*.



Of reports related to older people*

85% were female

5 report involved an adult who spoke a language other than English at home, with Mandarin the most commonly reported language


